INCREASE IN TRANSACTION LIMIT FOR FAST

Singapore - <u>Fast And Secure Transfers</u> (FAST) has been experiencing a steady increase in usage, since its launch on 17 March 2014. Over 1 million transactions are executed via FAST each month. With the convenience of FAST, corporate users have asked for a higher limit to cater to their business needs.

The Association of Banks in Singapore (ABS) is pleased to announce that effective 8 May 2015, the transaction limit for FAST will increase from \$10,000 to \$50,000. Customers will still be subjected to daily and monthly limits set by their banks.

FAST is a secure, 24 x 7 electronic funds transfer service that allows customers to transfer SGD funds between accounts of participating banks.
